

Mark W. Robinson is the Director of the Risk Management Services Division (RMSD), Office of Acquisition and Grants Administration at the U.S. Department of Education. Mark is responsible for leading the Division's efforts, in coordination with the Department's Principal Offices, to identify risks and take effective action to manage and mitigate risks that may adversely affect the Department's multi-billion dollar formula and discretionary grants portfolio and the advancement of the Department's mission and programs. The RMSD provides oversight, technical assistance, and grantee risk assessment, mitigation, and support to the Department's program offices. Mark leads the staff in identifying risk strategies and treatments in support of grant award monitoring plans and strategies, and corrective actions when required. Additionally, the division is responsible for policy development, implementation, and oversight for the Department's external audit follow-up function at the Department. The division resolves and closes grantee Single Audit findings of the Department's discretionary grant programs, as well as various formula grant audit findings, in accordance with OMB Uniform Guidance requirements. During his 30-year federal career, Mark has held a variety of leadership positions both at Education and the Office of Personnel Management. Mark received his Bachelor's degree from the University of Pennsylvania and a Master's Certificate in Information Technology Project Management from George Washington University.
